Mazzuchelli Musings

J esus Christ is Risen! Alleluia! Happy Easter to each and every one of you, as we celebrate the great joy of what Jesus has done for us by becoming fully Man, being pierced by our offenses, dying on the cross and destroying death and sin through his rising to new life. We actively participate in Jesus' work of redemption by participating in the life of the Catholic Church to whom Jesus has entrusted his authority, teaching, and sanctification. Through the Church, he restores our broken humanity but even more gives to us what was never ours before the fall, which is a share in his divinity by the life of grace.

In light of these beautiful truths, let us celebrate Easter in a very solemn way for 8 days after Easter Sunday until (Divine Mercy Sunday), but we continue to celebrate until Pentecost on May 19th. Let this time be filled with the joy that comes from self-discipline and sacrifice that we practiced during Lent, entrusting our daily works, joys, and sufferings to his providential care for us, and allowing the truth of Jesus' death and resurrection to truly penetrate into the depths of our heart. For many of us this requires trying to simplify our lives from activities in order to daily prioritize reading scripture, spending time in mental prayer, and striving to maintain both exterior and interior silence. If we don't take the time to truly know what's going on interiorly (in the depths of our heart) then we won't know what to bring to Jesus and ask what he wants us to do. Jesus didn't die for a day off but for the day of rest which is known as the day of rest, Sunday. Let us celebrate Easter by living our week days for the day of rest, Sunday.

Catholic Corner

Alleluia! He is Risen!

Saying those words is like drinking a tall glass of cold water after being out in the desert all day. Lent is over and it is now time to celebrate the great joy of Easter!

At the Easter Vigil, the Exsultet is sung as Mass begins in darkness, illumined only by candles throughout the church. The Exsultet is a beautiful hymn of rejoicing in Christ's triumph over sin and death. One part states:

O truly necessary sin of Adam, destroyed completely by the Death of Christ! O happy fault that earned for us so great, so glorious a Redeemer!

This line stands out because it calls the sin of Adam "necessary" and refers to it as "O happy fault." At first, this may seem strange. Why is it that we refer to the sin of Adam, Original Sin, as "necessary" and "happy." The answer is Easter. It's because God, in His perfect wisdom and love, took sin and the consequence of sin (death) and used them as the means of the salvation of the world. That's what Easter is all about!

This may be hard to comprehend so it's worth thinking about more deeply. Without Adam's sin, there would be no Jesus. God would not have had to become one of us. So even though the original sin of Adam, as well as all future sin, is evil and wrong, God in His perfect power and love chose to use it as the very means of the salvation of the world. How? By allowing the sins of the world to persecute Him and crucify Him, and then, by turning that suffering and death into the very means of salvation. Jesus destroyed sin by destroying the consequences of sin which is death. Death loses in the Resurrection! Jesus' Resurrection takes away the effects of all sin for those who cling to Him. Easter is a time when we must do just that. We must "cling" to our resurrected Lord!

Take joy in everything. Know that God wants you to experience the joy of Easter in your life. Let Him fill you with hope and with the joy that only the Resurrection can bring. God wants Easter to begin now in our lives! Happy Easter!

Lord, help me to let you transform every cross and burden in my life into joy. Lord, may Your joy fill my life and be my strength in all things. Jesus, I trust in You.



School and Religious Ed Financial Planning

Please join us for a brief presentation and conversation about our 3 catholic schools and and religious ED programs and the three year plan for how we will adapt the financial structures to our new reality as St. Dominic's Pastorate. We will have the same presentation on three different evenings, once at each school.

Tuesday April 2nd at 6:30pm at St. Joes Church in the gathering space, Thursday April 11th at 6:30pm at St. Rose of Lima church in the Fr. Mazzuchelli Hall Tuesday & April 16th at 5:30pm At HG-IC (Kieler campus Lower level)

This meeting will cover the current reality of each of the schools in our pastorate for both income and expenses. Then, we will delineate the financial structure we plan to adapt over a transition time of three years and request input for that plan. Finally, we will share a plan for a pastorate-wide Endowment Fund dedicated specifically to improving teacher salaries in each of our schools.

Please note: We do not anticipate any changes to the fundamental offerings of our academic programs. We have 3 great schools in our pastorate and the primary goal of this plan is to preserve them. This meeting will only cover adapting our accounting and financial structure. The experience of each student and parent in our schools should not be affected in any way by the content of this plan.
